Meeting Details

Pack 305 meets on **select Wednesdays at 6:30pm** at St. Petersburg Masonic Lodge #139, 3325 1st St. NE, St. Petersburg, FL (across 34th Ave from North Shore Elementary). There are no meetings during school holidays. **2025-26 Kickoff meeting is our August 27 Ice Cream Social.**

Scout meetings are either den meetings or pack meetings. In den meetings small groups or “dens” divided by grade work on adventures towards earning their rank and becoming more well rounded scouts. During pack meetings we all join together for service projects, awards, and fun. An adult partner must stay onsite during all meetings and other cub scout activities—**no drop offs.**

Our Adventures

- **Adventures & Rank Badges:** Each den works on adventures from their handbook, which provides achievements that are age-appropriate and help your scout earn their rank and other special honors. Our activities come from the Scouting America curriculum and teach values consistent with good citizenship, character development, personal fitness, and leadership.
- **Special Activities:** Pack 305 also has special outings and events throughout the year. We go bowling together, enjoy fishing, and enjoy learning about wildlife and conservation. Our scouts work to design and build their own cars and race them during our annual Pinewood Derby. We also participate in service projects such as food collections and cleanup projects. We love serving our community!
- **Escape the Indoors:** Pack 305 has at least two (and many times more) camping trips per year at scouting approved campsites in the Tampa Bay area. Many of our other activities take place outdoors as well. We also hold annual outdoor events including our Recycled Raingutter Regatta where scouts race boats made out of recycled materials.

How Much Does Scouting Cost?

The fees you pay cover the entire year's scouting adventures. We try to make the program as affordable and all-inclusive as possible. The fees you pay to Pack 305 will include:

- National youth registration fees/insurance
- Local council fee
- Pack dues (badges, awards, campsite fees, 1 pinewood derby kit, selected special events)
- First year scout uniforms: pack t shirt (activity uniform) and button down cub scout shirt (field uniform for Tigers-AOLs)

Required total: \$250 per scout

In addition to dues, all families are expected to participate in fundraising through our popcorn sales in the fall. This simple fundraiser helps the pack to offset the cost of things such as leader registrations and food for events. The buyout if a scout elects not to participate in fundraising is **\$100 per scout**.

Your Scout's Uniform

Scouts wear their Pack 305 t-shirt to den meetings, but they also have a field uniform shirt to wear for pack meetings and other special events. To go along with the field uniform scouts Tigers-Webelos need navy blue shorts or pants as well as a den specific neckerchief. Scouts in Lion-Bear dens need a belt for their advancements. Arrow of light rank scouts wear olive green shorts or pants. If you would like Pack 305 to purchase these on your behalf, please see pack leadership to arrange.
